President's Message

Fred Philips, DVM: As the Indiana State Trappers Association (ISTA) heads into its 55th year, the privilege of trapping in Indiana appears to be safe. The first otter season closed the first week of March with the quota of 600 otters being taken and registered. Be sure to get your CITES tag. The fur sale went well, despite the poor prices on furs and the lower turnout. Several notable Indiana Trappers did not sell a single fur at our auction. The auction was basically a break even event with over half of those selling being non-members. Some signed up, too many did not. The ISTA will miss the \$1500 that this event usually generates. To make that up, I ask each member to make a donation of at least \$5.00 for the general fund sometime during the year. You may send it in, or make it at any event you see the ISTA at.

We are also in need of a few more volunteers to serve on the Board. Our Vice-President, Lonnie Phillips, resigned following the election this past September for personal reasons. Unfortunately, Lonnie also felt compelled to remove himself from the computer committee and to withdraw his support of the Deer and Turkey Expo that he resurrected last year. Our representative to the FTA, Jesse Melton, also resigned due to his job responsibilities changing and fearing that he just could not do justice to the position. We have also re-activated the position of Trappers Education Coordinator and Deric Beroshok has taken that on along with his Director position for the moment. Lastly, Charlie Beason resigned as the ISTA / DNR Law Enforcement District Liaison for District 1 due to health reasons. These Liaisons are still finding their feet and developing their positions, but I am hoping that they will reach down into the grass roots of trappers and help our Association grow into something that makes sure trapping in Indiana goes on forever.

In the meantime, ISTA member trappers and non-member Trappers alike continue the tradition and sport of trapping, and strive to pass it on. Official, IDNR sanctioned, Trapping Education (TE) Classes are held around the State and are listed on PassItOnIndiana.com. Unofficial TE classes happen whenever a few trappers and trappers-to-be, get together for a short time. This is the future, so whenever you can introduce a person to trapping, please be sure to take advantage of the opportunity.

I have limited the advertising for this issue as a test to reduce the cost of publishing the newsletter. Eight pages are under an ounce for mailing, and 12 pages are over. Eight pages cost over \$74 less to mail and \$400 less to produce, per issue. Our advertising generally brought in about \$900. I think we will be ahead not making a mailing to solicit advertising and reducing the pages in each issue to reduce the overall cost. That is not to say that we won't appreciate contributions toward the production of our newsletter, and allow advertising as a consideration, but we need to conserve our resources some, especially as this year is shaping up.

I hope you had a good year trapping. Mine was under ten trap nights due to my own health, environment (the local authorities decided to clean the beaver dams out of the ditch I trap just as I got set up to trap), and the weather. If the ditches were not flooded, they were frozen solid. I do look forward to meeting and talking to you at one of our coming events.

Watch your top knot. Keep your eyes along the skyline.

This year's ISTA 55th Annual Convention and Rendezvous will be held September 16 & 17, 2016, at Mill Pond Park, 100 Mill Pond Rd., Union Mills, IN. 46382. Set up will begin Thursday, September 15th, at noon. On site primitive and electric hookup camping is available as is a small pond for fishing and demo's. There is a nice paved path for tailgaters to set up off of and a nice pond to watch the ducks and demos on.

The IDNR is planning to have the next HOE in the spring of 2017. Hence, our 55th Convention and Rendezvous will not be in conflict with this event, and next year, September has five (5) Saturdays again.

NEW WEBSITE

Deer and Turkey Expo

The Booth was next to the NTA's booth that Stu Grell manned and managed, but that way they could cover for each other. Stu had several people help him through the weekend while Paul had Byron Tiede help on Saturday and Fred Philips helped on Sunday. Paul is planning on continuing to do this event, so if you are interested in helping out, let him know.

Indiana Trappers Take Note

Dave Hastings, the editor for the FTA's Fur Takers magazine sent this note to the ISTA in general. Based on conversations with IDNR personnel, the following may be of interest to trappers in Indiana, who are concerned about otter, and now bobcat, trapping opportunities for ten-year-old children. It has been an issue of discussion, and it may be that the position could be reviewed in the near future. The regulation concerning anyone ten years old and under not being allowed to participate in otter trapping in Indiana is currently part of Indiana's administrative rule/code (312 Indiana Administrative Code 9-3-18.2) related to harvest of river otter. It was created as a compromise based on comments that the DNR received when they originally started the two-year rule process for the river otter season in 2013. The rule allows a 10-year old to trap otter, but they must have attended a state approved trapper education course (which was the compromise). The minimum age restriction is not tied to CITES. Administrative codes are not set in stone, but are usually updated every two years. The Indiana Division of Fish and Wildlife recently started another rule proposal cycle. This provides an opportunity for housekeeping (to clean up code) or propose new rules. Currently, past Furbearer Biologist, Shawn Rosseler proposed a bobcat season, as well as a rule that would allow for year-around possession of fur. It is too early to tell, but it is likely that the rule about the ten-year-old otter trapping may come up in discussion, and may be similarly discussed in reference to bobcat. The IN Division of Wildlife will take public comment on the proposed rule as well as any comments on our current regulations. It may be a good time for the trappers who have concerns to team together and provide comments on the ten-year-old regulation for otter, as it would also relate to a bobcat season. The public comment process is known as GotINput. The webpage should be active and available for comment in early 2016. Here is a link to the GotINput webpage: <http://www.in.gov/dnr/fishwild/7373.htm>. Again, the new session will go live sometime early in 2016. As of March 7th, 2016, it was not yet accepting comments. (PS: IN Trappers will be disappointed to learn that Shawn Rossler has taken a job with the Wisconsin DNR. He was at the center of creating the opportunity to trap both otter and now bobcat. His hard work will be missed in IN.)

FIRST OTTER SEASON A SUCCESS

On about March 10th, the 600th Otter was registered and Indiana's first Otter season closed. I believe that this is a testament to the science behind the decision of setting a 600 quota. I really thought that this quota would be met by December 31, 2015, but low prices on fur and adverse weather conditions help to limit the take. I also truly believe that the science applied by the IDNR and lead by Furbearer Biologist Shawn Rossler told them exactly what the Otter population in Indiana would allow to be taken. There were several individuals who participated in the creation of our first Otter season over the years, Shawn Rossler just was

able to finish it off and put the icing on the cake. Scott Johnson was there at the beginning. In the absence of Shawn, I contacted Scott Johnson, Wildlife Science Program Manager. He reported that 57 Otter had been killed in 2015 outside of the legal trapping season. Of the 57 reported to the IDNR, 33 were trapped in Jan & Feb 2015, 20 were road-kills, one (1) was shot, one (1) was killed on a nuisance permit, one (1) drowned in hoop net, and one (1) death by an unknown cause. It will be interesting to see how many are killed on the roads this year. As I recall, 2014 saw over 70 killed, and wasted, on the roads.

ISTA Board of Directors Meeting (Approval Pending) 03/05/2016

Meeting brought to order by President Fred Philips at 10:17am at the NSSB bank in Danville, IN.

Roll Call/Quorum Established: Members present with Fred were Deric Beroshok, Georgia Gifford, Stu Grell, Melissa Mansfield, Tom Setser, and Paul Waldman.

Reading of past minutes: Melissa moved to forego the reading of the past minutes as it was approved by email and published in the post-convention newsletter. Stu 2nd the motion, all agreed, motion approved.

Secretary's Report: No further report to be made.

Treasurer's Report: Georgia advised that the fur auction liquidity money was transferred back into the Lifetime Savings account. She distributed the bank statements and gave ending balances as of 03/04/2016: members may get these balances by sending Georgia a self-addressed stamped envelope with their request. The ISTA is liquid at this time and doing well.

Georgia stated that she will have a summary for the whole year (income and expenses), and all original bank statements ready for Fred for tax filing purposes ASAP. Melissa M. motioned to accept Treasurer's Report, Tom S. 2nd, all agreed, report approved.

Vice President's Report: No report / Position open at beginning of meeting, no VP report.

Directors' Reports: Paul Waldman advised the board that the booth at the Kokomo Sports Show was a success with some merchandise sold and 4 new members signing up using the NTA combo promotion. He also reported that the Indianapolis Deer & Turkey

Expo was a big success with 5 new junior members and lots of gun raffles tickets sold. A Big Thanks for Paul for his hard work at both shows and for his donation of \$160 of his expense money given back to the Association. **Tom Setser** stated that the 4-H activities start up again on 4/16/16 and he has 5 new students to add to the class. Linnea Petercheff is organizing another outdoor experience with Tom demonstrating beaver control. He also said that Noah and Elliott are both insistent on helping out as well. Tom told the board that the 4-H board was looking for sponsors for 1st(\$18) and 2nd(\$17) place plaques for the Furbearer Trapping project in Hendricks County 4-H. Melissa M. moved to sponsor both places and Paul W. 2nd. All agreed, **Motion #1 approved.** Paul had a conversation with a Marion College Professor who would like a speaker for his class. He has Paul's contact information and will be in touch to hopefully set up a time for him to address the students. **Deric Beroshok** stated that he is working to get the website all updated with correct officers and information for the members to utilize. He mentioned that he has had several calls from members with questions and got answers for them at the meeting. **Stu Grell, NTA Director**, mentioned that the Kokomo Sports Expo gained the NTA and the ISTA 5 new members and 2 renewals for the NTA. He stated that at the Indy Deer & Turkey Expo, he signed on 3 new members with the NTA combo promotion and also sold some merchandise for the ISTA and the NTA, thinking

that it was a good weekend for both Associations. He commented on the fact that he could have sold a Lifetime ISTA member hat, but was unable to find any in our inventory. It was discussed on a counted inventory to be conducted and any shortages to be looked at possibly replacing. Stu stated he received a request for a donation to the Vermont Association's FBU banquet and the Board declined to donate this year. It was determined that there was likely to be enough people attend the NTA banquet that the ISTA has agreed to buy a table. Stu moved to spend \$290 to do that, Georgia G. 2nd, all agreed, **Motion #2 approved.** **January 27, 2016, by email, Stu moved to donate \$200 towards the purchase of a gun for the NTA's FBU raffle at the National Convention. All were in favor via email, motion passed.**

FTA Director: No report / position is open at this time. Trapper Education Coordinator: Deric

Beroshok: May 7th will be the Carthage TE course, with CO Scott Johnson, Henry County Conservation Officer, heading the class. (This is not the same Scott Johnson, Wildlife Science Program Manager, mentioned above.) April 2nd there will be a TE class at the Hoosier Trapper Supply with CO Markie Throgmorton in charge. Deric advised that with the selling of the Ivy Tech facility that he used last year, the location of the Kokomo TE course is questionable and thus the dates are unknown for now. Tom Setser's class will be in late August with dates to be determined at a later date. Stu Grell's Raccoon Lake TE will be held once again on the first full weekend of November, the 5th & 6th.

President's Report: Fred has attended many of the state's FTA chapter events and stated that they all said they loved the fact that Fred (and the Association he represents) acknowledges their activities. He mentioned that the Bloomington TE has been moved to Aug. with date to be determined and that he believes Ron Elliott will still be having the LaPorte TE class again in November as usual.

Old Business/ New Business;

Jamie Brown, Lumanis, has been paid in full for all services to the old website and has released the domain name for the new website. It is up and running with Deric updating as needed.

Georgia stated that trailer plates and insurance has been paid. It was suggested and agreed that new youth members should receive a free ISTA shirt. Deric

brought up the discussion of traps for TE and youth gifting. It was determined that more are needed and he will contact trap manufacturers for more donations. Fred attended the FWCC meeting and advised that another 2 year cycle on rule changes has arrived and comments will be accepted between 4/1/16 and 5/15/16. Fred was also there to attend the FWAC (Advisory Committee), but it didn't take place because not enough people stuck around to attend. Sportsman Alliance (USSA) is asking for us to continue our membership which actually expired on 10/21/15. Deric moved to pay \$500 to renew our membership, Paul 2nd, all agreed, **Motion #3 approved.** The Hoosier Outdoor Experience has been moved to the Spring of 2017 which will allow us to attend with it not being the weekend of our convention. Deric moved to give the FTA for their Sweepstakes, \$100 gift certificate for the Hoosier Trappers Supply, Stu 2nd, all agreed, **Motion #4 approved.**

Georgia Gifford moved to appoint Tom Setser to the Vice President position, all members were in favor, new appointment to be served for remainder (election in Fall 2016) of two year term approved. It was decided to invite Byron Tiede to a meeting to interview him for the open Director's position created with Tom Setser's VP appointment. The By-laws should be revised to clear up any vague issues, but there will be no major changes at this time. The Election of Officers and Directors will remain as it is. Next meeting tentatively set for May 21st, in conjunction with possible member meeting held somewhere at or near Fred's office in Rush County. With all issues having been discussed and no further business to attend to, Georgia moved to adjourn, all 2nd, and meeting was adjourned at 12:23 pm.

NTA ALERT.
U.S. Senate Committee Approves Bipartisan Sportsmen's Act

The Bipartisan Sportsmen's Act of 2016 has passed out of committee and now it is up to us to do everything we can to see that it gets passed. The Bills that make up The Bipartisan Sportsmen's Act include the most critical items for the hunting and conservation community. This includes a key provision sponsored by Sen. John Barrasso (R- Montana) directing the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to remove gray wolves from the Endangered Species List. Despite greatly exceeding population targets for delisting, anti-hunting groups have, for years, successfully used the Federal Courts to keep wolves protected.

The Act revises a variety of existing programs to expand access opportunities for hunting, fishing, and recreational shooting. The bill would require land under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Land Management or the Forest Service must by default, be open for hunting, fishing, and recreational shooting unless the managing agency finds cause to close the land. The language will protect hunting and increase hunting access on millions of acres of public land. Perhaps most importantly, trapping would be included under the definition of "hunting" for the first time in Federal Law.

The attempt by Sen. Cory Booker (D-NJ) to include a ban on trapping on the 150 million-acre National Wildlife Refuge System failed after committee members received a deluge of emails and letters from trappers, the fur industry and state wildlife agencies.

The committee also rejected an attempt by Sen. Barbara Boxer (D-California) to remove language preventing the EPA from regulating lead in ammunition. Sen. Boxer is a regular opponent of pro-hunting measures. She has committed to publicly fight the Bipartisan Sportsmen's Act on the floor, and is seeking to organize a filibuster. Sportsmen calls are needed immediately.
